About Our Pastors:

Our Senior Pastor, Alan Redditt is the son of Dr. Paul and Bonnie Redditt. Alan grew up in Georgetown, where he attended Faith Baptist Church and graduated from Scott County High School and Georgetown College (2000). He is married to the former Megan Williams of Paducah, KY. Megan is also a graduate of Georgetown College and has a Masters of Arts in Marriage and Family Counseling from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary.

During college, Alan became affirmed that God was leading him into Christian ministry. After graduating, he furthered his ministry education at two graduate schools. He obtained his Master of Divinity at McAfee School of Theology (2003) and later his Master of Theology at Duke University Divinity School (2006). Most recently, Alan has completed his Clinical Pastoral Education training and is a Board Certified Chaplain recognized by the Association of Professional Chaplains (2009). Our Associate Pastor, Richard Weekley, is a 1972 graduate of The University of South Carolina with a B.S. in Education. He received the Master of Divinity degree from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky in 1988. About Our Ministries:

Worship Ministry

Adult Worship – Georgetown Baptist Church has a traditional worship celebration Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

Children's Worship – There is a children's worship service at 9:00 a.m. & 11:00 a.m. each Sunday. This service is for children grades 1 – 6.

Education Ministry

Our educational program is rooted in the belief that God has gifted people in various ways “to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up...” (Eph. 4:12)

The primary educational programs of Georgetown Baptist Church include:

Sunday School - Bible Study - Teaching and Reaching Ministry. Georgetown Baptist Church has a complete age graded pre-school, elementary, and youth Bible study program. In addition, there are needs and age defined adult classes. At the current time, all Sunday School classes meet on Sunday morning at 10:00 a.m.

Discipleship Ministry – DiscipleLIFE. Selected courses of study for youth, college students and adults offered September through April each year at 6:00 p.m. Typically there are several small group studies offered each semester. Each individual is free to select areas of study most interesting to them.

Mission Education – Mission Friends, RAs, GAs and Youth on Mission - There are graded mission education programs for children ages 3 -18. Mission education is offered each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. September - May.

Music Ministry and Education

Georgetown Baptist Church has a full complement of age graded choirs beginning with preschoolers and extending all the way through the youth department. Currently our children's choirs are meeting during our DiscipleLIFE time, Sunday evenings at 6:00 p.m.

About Our Heritage:

"Throughout its existence, Georgetown Baptist Church has been deeply involved in missions work. One of the earliest surviving documents from the Church's history is the constitution of the Baptist Female Mission Society of Georgetown, formed in 1819 to fund missionary work with the American Indians. In the 1820-50's, the Church held frequent concerts of prayer for missions and collected money regularly to support missionaries to the Indians and to China.

In the twentieth century, Georgetown Baptist continued to give financial support to missionary work throughout the world, primarily through the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptist Convention. For many years the church was among the top twenty contributors in Kentucky to the Cooperative Program. In the 1990s, the church also began supporting missions through the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship.

Members of Georgetown Baptist Church themselves participated in missions work. In the 1980s-90s, members of the church undertook mission trips to Kenya and Mexico. The Church has been involved with other Scott County congregations in the work of the Amen House, Habitat for Humanity, and the Migrant Coalition. Other members have been involved in a "back-of-the-track" ministry for workers at Keeneland.

Georgetown Baptist began several mission congregations which grew into self-supporting churches: Gano Avenue Baptist Church, Lyle Road Baptist Church, Royal Spring Baptist Church, Gardenside Baptist Church (Lexington), Highlands Baptist Church (Lexington), and Mallard Point Baptist Church. Additionally, Georgetown Baptist provided assistance in the rejuvenation of Sadieville Baptist Church as a self-sustaining church in the 1980s.

In the 1990s, Georgetown Baptist Church began a new day of ministry. Under the leadership of Pastor Kenneth D. Holden, the Church has experienced significant growth and renewed fellowship. The constitution of Georgetown Baptist Church today declares that "the purpose of the Church is to glorify God. This glorification of God is accomplished through worship, discipleship, evangelism, ministry and fellowship."
